

# HOW TO STUDY?

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## Prepare for the test

Make sure you know:

- What the test is about?
- How long is the test?
- What is the type of test (open / multiple choice questions, online/ offline, etc.)?
- What can you use in the test (dictionary book / talking, calculator etc.)?

## Manage your time

- Divide the material to be reviewed into small chunks every day before the test.
- Quick review of things done in class (including simulations, movies, etc.).
- Review previous homework, quizzes and tests - do not repeat the same mistakes!!!
- Have a good night sleep before the test.
- Make notes of important things (mind map).



## Remember:

- The more you repeat the exercises, the better you remember and understand things.
- Most questions in the test come from homework, worksheet, quizzes, workbook, etc. that you have already done.
- If you don't understand something; ask your teacher (or a friend) before the test.

## During the test

- Read the instructions carefully.
- Quick review of the whole test before you begin.
- Don't rush, manage your time.
- Leave the last 5 minutes to make sure you answered all the questions.
- Give priority to questions with high marks.
- Answer the easy questions first.
- If you don't know the answer, make a mark and continue to the next question.
- You may find the answer later, don't waste too much time on one question.
- Make sure you understand the questions and answer them correctly.



### Examples:

When the question asks you to:

- **Explain** - you are expected to explain a process and how it works.
- **Compare** - explain the things that are the same and things that are different in a given situation.
- **Meaning** - what is the meaning/ definition of a word or concept.
- **Give examples** - two or more examples that clarify your explanation.

With open questions make sure to use key words (the most important words).

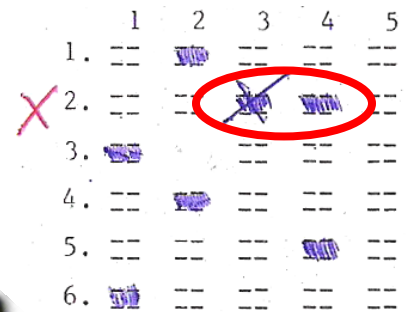
Ex. When writing about global warming you must use the words: pollution, carbon dioxide, greenhouse effect, heat,

Read your answer after you completed it to see if it makes sense.



With multiple choice questions eliminate answers that are wrong for sure.

- ✓ Guessing between 4 answers gives you 25% chances to succeed.
- ✓ Guessing between 3 answers gives you 33% chances to succeed.
- ✓ Guessing between 2 answers gives you 50% chances to succeed.
- ✓ Knowing the answer gives you 100% chance to succeed.



On the multiple questions answer sheet

Make sure that wrong answer is completely deleted using eraser

for pencil

or liquid paper for pen

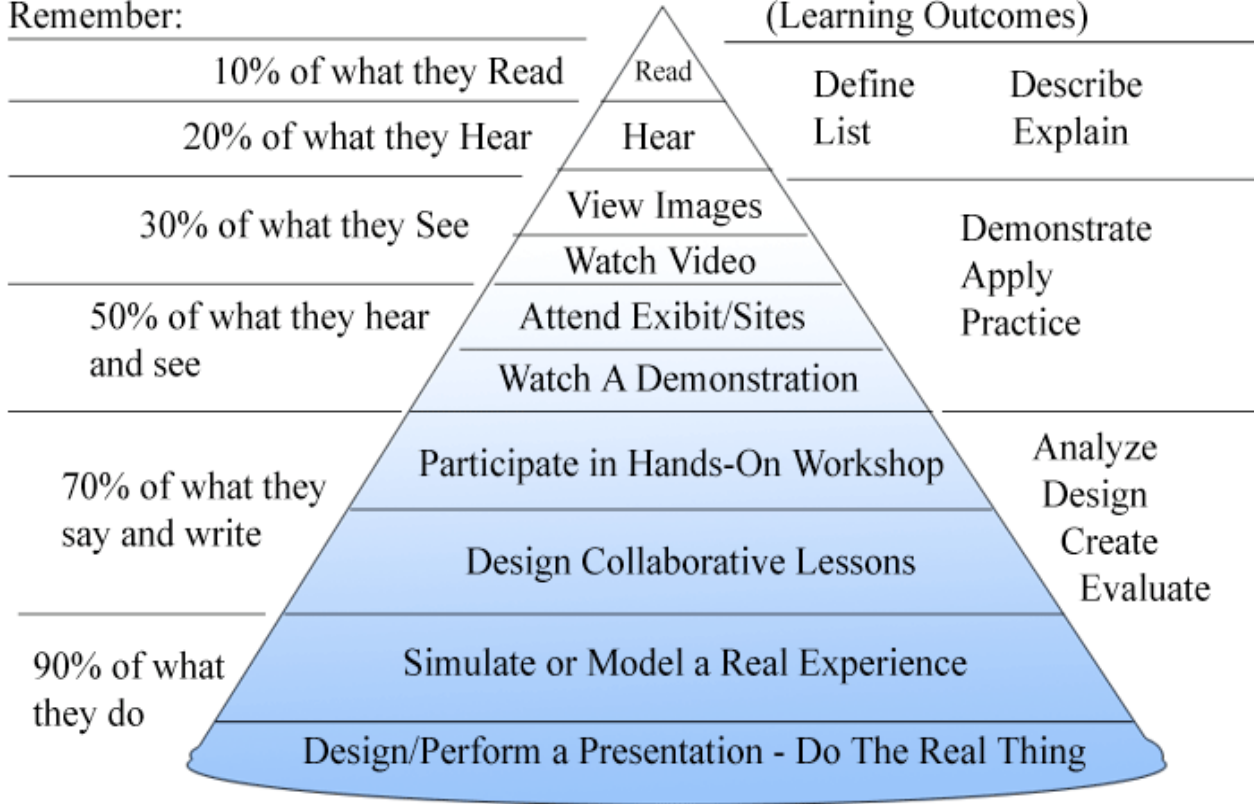


Make sure you write the correct answer in the correct place
